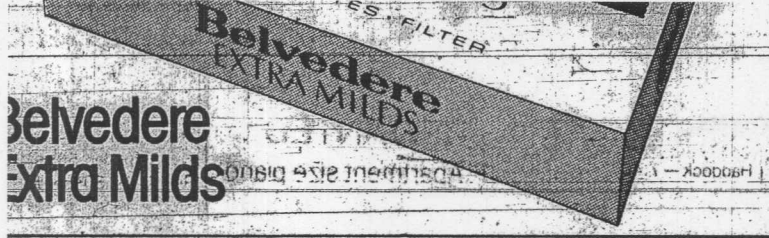
- **Protect local community businesses by legislating a moratorium on the construction of large shopping malls until an impact study has been carried out and the public fully consulted.**

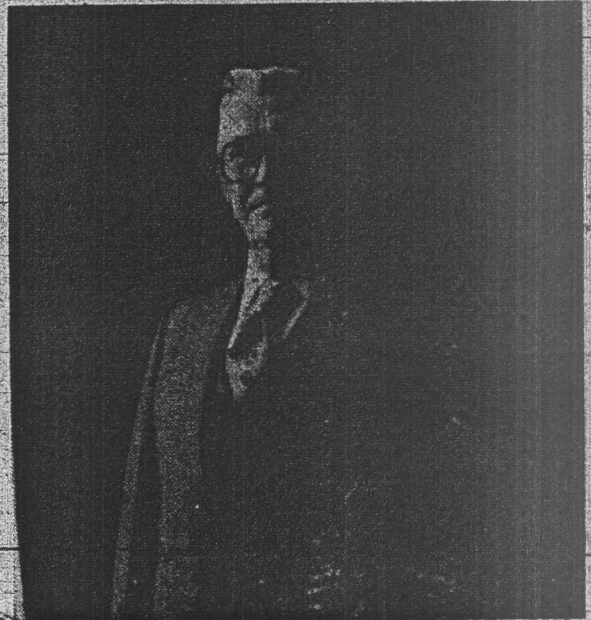

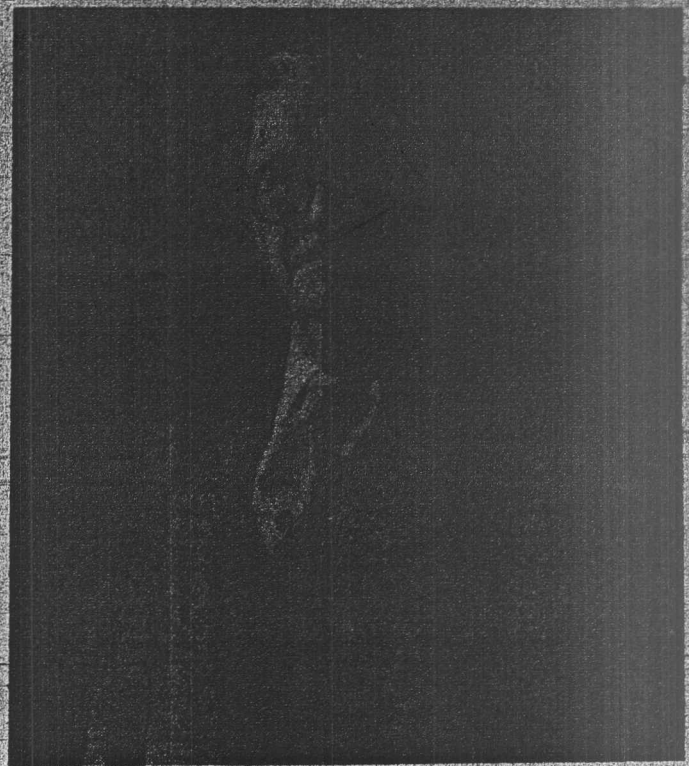
