# LIBERAL PLATFORM BASIS LAID

## Party's convention at Saskatoon approves nearly 50 resolutions

Some 45 to 50 resolutions dealing with everything from agriculture and labor to health matters and education, were approved by the provincial Liberal convention at Saskatoon.

It is these resolutions that will form the basis of the new Liberal platform — the platform through which the Liberal party will endeavor to re-organize its forces in Saskatchewan to oust the C.C.F. from office.

Here are the resolutions:

### Agriculture

The importance of agriculture in the economy of Saskatchewan is recognized and accepted by every citizen. Its establishment and maintenance on a sound profitable basis is essential to the welfare of the province. The Saskatchewan Liberal party will keep before it at all times the

necessity of forming its policies in such a way as to assure the future progress and prosperity of our great agricultural industry.

The Saskatchewan Liberal party pledges itself:

1. To utilize all the facilities of the agricultural college, the agricultural department and a reasonable share of the revenues in co-operation, with the Dominion department of agriculture:

- (a) To survey and maintain the fertility of the soil;
- (b) To organize submarginal areas into community pastures;
- (c) To store water for stock watering and distribution through irrigation.

The Saskatchewan Liberal party believes that the growth and promotion of co-operative enterprises in the province can only continue so long as the right of private ownership and free enterprise is recognized as the basic principle in our economic and social life, and the principle of socialism is destructive to the co-operative movement.

2. To support the Dominion government in its efforts to stabilize returns to the farmers of this province by:

- (a) Giving full and complete effect and improve the Prairie Farm Assistance act.

(b) Extending the application of the Prairie Farm Rehabilitation act to the entire province.

(c) Grading and standardizing our products to meet the demands of our customers in other provinces and outside Canada.

(d) Entering into contracts with Britain which assure markets at relatively high floor prices for all our surpluses over long periods.

(e) Establishing production and marketing methods which while maintaining continuity of supplies, will also prevent avoidable surpluses.

### Irrigation

The Saskatchewan Liberal party believes that it is essential in the interest of large areas of our province that irrigation schemes be constructed with a view to putting into production marginal and other lands that have been incapable in the past of producing paying crops. The Saskatchewan Liberal party pledges itself in co-operation with the federal government to utilize all available water for irrigation projects in stock industry and its vital place in the agricultural economy, the order to create more profitable communities in those areas which have suffered from drought in the past and bring about a more prosperous and contented people. We commend the federal government for undertaking the construction in the handling and mar-

### Co-operation

The Saskatchewan Liberal party pioneered in promoting the co-operative movement in Canada, and the success and development of co-operative enterprise in Saskatchewan, has been due to the

legislation relating to co-operation which has been introduced from time to time by Liberal governments. The Liberal party believes that the co-operative movement is above party politics and that it

should so remain and believe that political interference is prejudicial to the success of true co-operation.

The Saskatchewan Liberal party believes that the growth and promotion of co-operative enterprises in the province can only continue so long as the right of private ownership and free enterprise is recognized as the basic principle in our economic and social life, and the principle of socialism is destructive to the co-operative movement.

Therefore, the Saskatchewan Liberal party pledges itself: In the future as in the past, to encourage and assist the development and expansion of the co-operative movement believing as we do that it is the true and free expression of democracy and free enterprise.

**Federal Marketing Act**

The Saskatchewan Liberal party believes that one of the most effective methods of maintaining farm production is the assurance to the producer of the orderly marketing of farm produce at fair prices. This has been clearly demonstrated in the past five years by the operation of the special products board.

The Saskatchewan Liberal party pledges itself to support a request to the federal government that a "federal agricultural marketing act" be set up providing for the marketing of different farm products by boards to be chosen from the producers themselves, such act to become operative in any province when such province passes enabling legislation, with provision that such act shall not be operative without a vote of the producers.

**Irrigation**

The Saskatchewan Liberal party believes that there should be in the province a system of inter-provincial federal highways to be constructed and maintained by the Dominion government, and when returned to power will negotiate an agreement with the federal government with a view to turning over to the Dominion certain specific trans-provincial highways to be part of a Canada-wide hard-surfaced system of highways for the purpose of encouraging tourist traffic throughout the entire Dominion.

Realizing the importance of good roads to all citizens in the province, the Saskatchewan Liberal party pledges itself: To improve and maintain all provincial highways, bringing them up to highest possible standard of construction within the means of the province, and to purchase sufficient modern equipment to enable the province to make such equipment available to num-

bered themselves to government operation be allowed to become government utilities or crown corporations.

The Saskatchewan Liberal party pledges itself: to the establish-

ment of a contributory pension scheme designed to progressively reduce retirement age to 60 years.

To the revision of unemployment insurance plan to make it applicable to employed persons

regardless of income and make possible a more adequate benefit for the temporarily unemployed.

The enactment of such legis-

lation applicable to industrial and service employment to encourage the bringing about of basic 40-hour week, such legislation not to be applicable to the agricultural industry.

The Liberal party of Saskatchewan believes that the first requisite of the attainment and maintenance of an adequate standard of living is a high and continuous level of employment, with adequate wages which can be brought about by:

(a) Harmonious relations between employee and employer.

(b) That the age for retirement be reduced.

(c) Provision for adequate un-

employment insurance.

(d) Reduced hours of work.

Be it resolved that the Liberal party of Saskatchewan endorses the following labor relations policy:

1. The exemption for a married man be increased to \$2,000 and for single persons to \$1,000. 2. That for each dependent an exemption of \$400 be allowed. 3. In addition in respect to the agriculture industry other than an allowance or allowances be made for wife and children for their work and services rendered or that a fixed percentage of the proceeds realized from the sale of dairy products, and poultry and hogs be allowed and deducted from such income.

**Highways**

The Saskatchewan Liberal party believes that there should be in the province a system of inter-provincial federal highways to be constructed and maintained by the Dominion government, and when returned to power will negotiate an agreement with the federal government with a view to turning over to the Dominion certain specific trans-provincial highways to be part of a Canada-wide hard-surfaced system of highways for the purpose of encouraging tourist traffic throughout the entire Dominion.

**Long Term Leases**

As security of tenure of grazing leases and reasonable fees for such leases are essential to maintain the cattle and ranching industry of the province and necessary to encourage the development of mixed farming, be it resolved that the Saskatchewan Liberal party in convention assembled pledges itself when returned to power:

(a) to guarantee security to all long term leaseholders and the first right of renewal on the expiration of the lease;

(b) to provide the right to the holder to assign or transfer such lease subject to the approval of the department;

(c) to re-establish fees for such grazing leases that are fair to the lessor and the lessee alike.

**Farm Security**

It is recognized that an provincial legislation which gives real protection and security to the farmers of Saskatchewan was legislation based on
