Judge and Bowerman also bought the top priced female, Fairview Mischief Lass 40N, a half sister of the top bull, for \$2,050.

This was a Canadian record for a polled Hereford female.

Also attending the sale were Alex and "Sandy" Campbell of Kinellar, Scotland, Douglas Kennedy, British Livestock Exports, London, Eng., and John Young of King's Lynn, Norfolk, Eng.

Although the sale constituted a Canadian record it should be noted that "Sandy" Campbell made a private purchase of a show bull calf from Mr. Olson for a price of \$5,500.

Mr. Campbell purchased the bull, Fairview Choice Domino, in partnership with Albert Watson of Aberdeenshire and A. W. Taylor of Fife, Scotland.

Mr. Campbell also bought an acre for John Hall of Chitthill, Northumberland, and J. Duncan of Aberdeenshire.

Although British buyers dominated the sale it was significant that representatives of the American Hereford Association and the Canadian and Saskatchewan associations were also in attendance.

Walter M. Lewis, of Larner, Kan., a past-president and a director of the American group, Charles H. Leach of Calgary, secretary of the Canadian Hereford Association and N. W. Stronach of North Battleford, secretary of the Saskatchewan association, attended.

Mr. Lewis complimented the breeders for presenting such an outstanding offering.

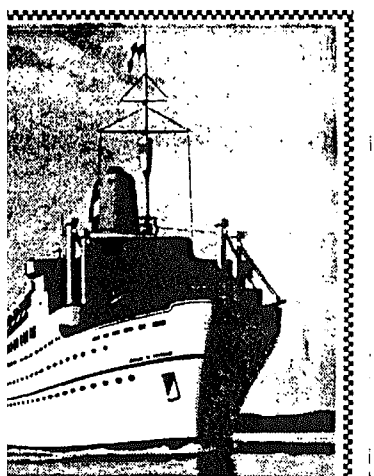
